

For John Carroll Medical Providers to receive and/or for campers to self-carry medication including EpiPens and inhalers, you must print, complete, and return the Medication Administration Authorization Form for Youth Camps in Maryland available at www.johncarroll.org/medicationauthorization. Please turn these forms into John Carroll before camp begins or on the first day of camp.

Before proceeding to the John Carroll campus each parent/legal guardian is requested to check their child's temperature and symptoms associated with COVID-19. All camp personnel, campers, and parents/legal guardians who wish to be admitted to camps must undergo daily health screenings when arriving on campus.

Within the last 24 hours have you had any of the following symptoms: -Cough -Shortness of breath - Fever-100 degrees Fahrenheit -Muscle pain -New loss of taste or smell

If a camper, staff member or parent/legal guardian possess any of these symptoms or a temp of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher during the check-in health screenings or during camp they will not be permitted to participate, will be asked to leave campus and to follow up with their medical provider.

Each camper must come with a face mask and we kindly request that parent/guardians do not enter the camp area unless they are carrying medication for their camper. Parents entering camp will be required to follow social distancing protocol, and to come with a face mask.
